



THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE

The National Committee is the governing body of the Young Republican National Federation (YRNF).

MEMBERSHIP

Members of the National Committee include three members of each state federation in good-standing: State Chair, National Committeeman and National Committeewoman. Members also include the chairs of each standing committees, Regional Directors, National Officers and the Chairman Emeritus.

NATIONAL MEETINGS

Meetings of the National Committee are held at least three times annually: one in the Spring (February, March, April or May), one in the summer (June, July or August) and one in the fall (September, October or November). In even years, the spring meeting is held in conjunction with the Young Republican Leadership Conference. In odd years, the summer meetings are held before and after the Young Republican National Convention.

Meeting Attendance: each state is required to have at least one representative (state chair, national committeeman or national committeewoman) attend each national committee meeting. A proxy (substitute representative) from the same state may be sent in the absence of a national committee member. A state that fails to send a representative will be required to pay a penalty fee and may forfeit their state charter.

ROLE

A member of the National Committee is an official representative of the Young Republican National Federation and a recognized leader for Young Republicans. Members of the National Committee represent their state federation to the national organization and serve as its voice to the national leadership. Members represent the interests of Young Republican elected officials, local clubs and their Young Republican members located within their state.

RESPONSIBILITY

The National Committee is led by the National Chairman and national officers, who also serve as the Board of Directors for the Young Republican National Federation. Together, the Young Republican National Federation is responsible for advancing its mission to support the Republican Party and delivering on its goals to recruit, train and elect.



EXPECTATIONS

As a member of the National Committee, the following is a brief list of your responsibilities:

National Meetings

- Attend national meetings in coordination with your state delegation
- Attend the national convention and organize Young Republicans from within your state to serve as delegates and alternate delegates to the convention

National Goals

- Work with your state's leadership team to develop a plan of action based on the national goals
- Work with your state's leadership team to execute your plan for the national goals within your state
- Submit data as requested regarding national goals and related information

National Days of Action & Deployments

- Participate in national days of action and organize Young Republicans from within your state to participate
- Participate in national deployments within reasonable driving distance and organize Young Republicans from within your state to participate
- Make sure your state is represented at national activities as directed by the national chairman

Renewal of State Charters

- Ensure the submission of all required documents and data by the deadline

Notification

- Adhere to the notification policy by informing the national chairman of the date, time and location of a state election via email no later than 30 days prior to an election
- Inform the national chairman of the election of state officers no later than 30 days after an election

Communication

- Meet with national leaders periodically
- Respond to requests and electronic communications within 72 hours
- Meet deadlines for meetings, reports and submissions
